<p>1. Schools were selected with a crude random method. The selection began with only community colleges in Michigan, but after discussing AUPs with six CIOs/administrators from a wider range of schools, we turned to the Carnegie Classifications as a means of developing categories for comparative measures. These other types of schools revealed differences that invited another set of assessments, the ones in this spreadsheet.</p> <p>2. Our goal is twofold: first, to develop a more productive set of criteria for assessing AUPs, and then to apply them to differing categories of post-secondary institutions. From these discussions, we have inferred the model AUP implicit in the criteria.</p> <p>3. Our current "hypothesis," to the extent that the term fits, is that there might be gradients of control, collaboration, and conceptualization that distinguish post-secondary institutions across a spectrum from training institutions to research institutions.</p>		Note: This criterion addresses the <i>form</i> of governance. It refers to formal, institutional structures such as committees.	Note: "Conflict resolution" refers to conflicts between the constituents of the IT environment, e.g., between technical administration and faculty about the management of bandwidth demands, or conflicts between administrators' notions of appropriate use and academic freedom issues. Conflict resolution is not the same as enforcement of rules.
